

## The Coastal Community Endowment Fund – 2008 Grant Awards

- **\$ 5,000 to Altamaha RiverKeeper** for the purchase and upgrade new laptops and network access for the organization, storing and sharing of data.
- **\$2,100 to America's Second Harvest** for the purchase of two new computers for the Brunswick area office to enable use of new inventory system for online food orders. Purchase of television for volunteer training.
- **\$2,300 to CMAP** for the training of two staff members in the Stanford Model for qualification to lead workshops on the self-management of chronic diseases.
- **\$3,900 to Coastal Coalition for Children/Latin American Resource Center program** for the purchase of all materials for the enhancement of the tutoring/mentoring program and the English for Moms classes.
- **\$3,000 to Communities of Schools of Glynn** for the development of a five-year strategic plan under the direction of a professional consultant in conjunction with the Archway Project under the direction of the University of Georgia.
- **\$2,000 to The Gathering Place** for the purchase of two years online membership of a donor management system which can be used on all agency computers.
- **\$5,000 to Golden Isles Children's Center** for the purchase of new digital video recording system for use in recording forensic interviews of child abuse victims for the purpose of prosecuting offenders.
- **\$4,000 to McIntosh SEED** for a new Youth Education in Leadership and Life Skills (Project YELL) program with the goal of education 8-12<sup>th</sup> graders in the study of local issues and career skills along with personal and professional etiquette.
- **\$5,000 to McIntosh Family Connection** for the purchase of books for use in the "Bingo for Books" program conducted during the current school year involving students, parents, and teachers in the distribution of free books for elementary and middle schools students.
- **\$1,700 to Glynn Community Crisis Center** for the purchase of a new computer and associated equipment for the new Hope House transitional center.
